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Fig. S1. Clinical erythema assessment of metronidazole and ivermectin

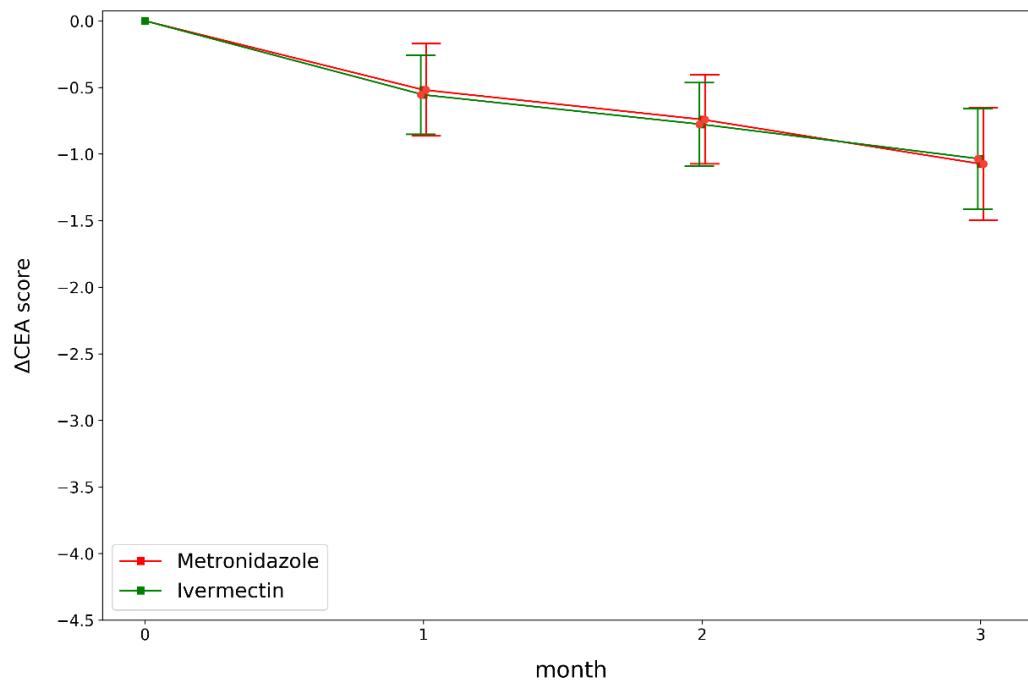


Fig. S2. Erythema score of metronidazole and ivermectin (*: $p < 0.05$)

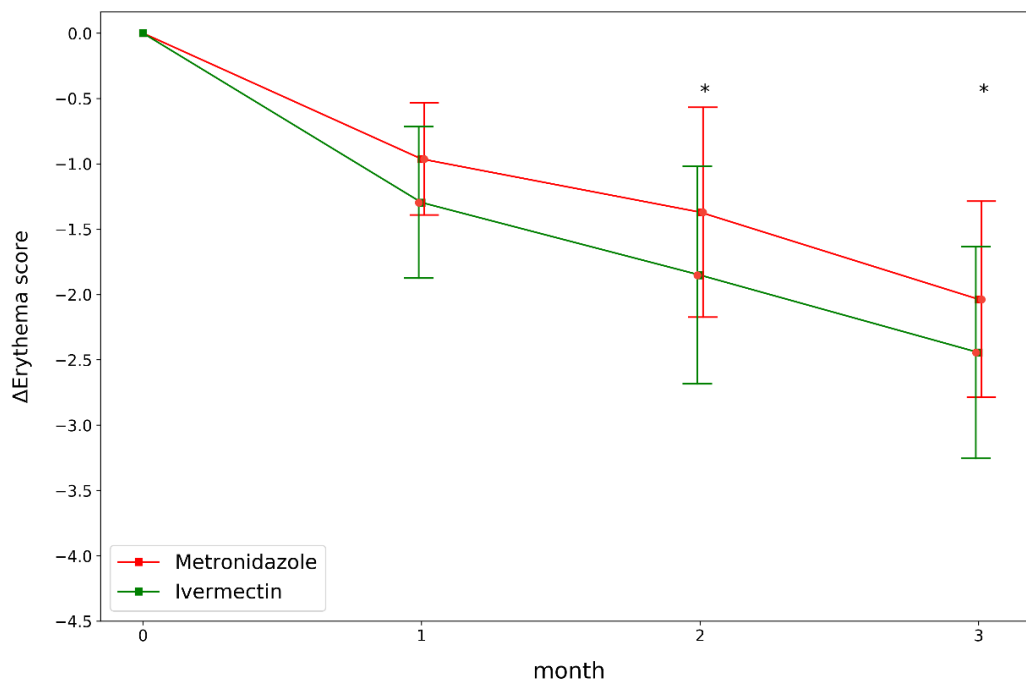


Fig. S3. Warmth score of metronidazole and ivermectin (*: $p < 0.05$)

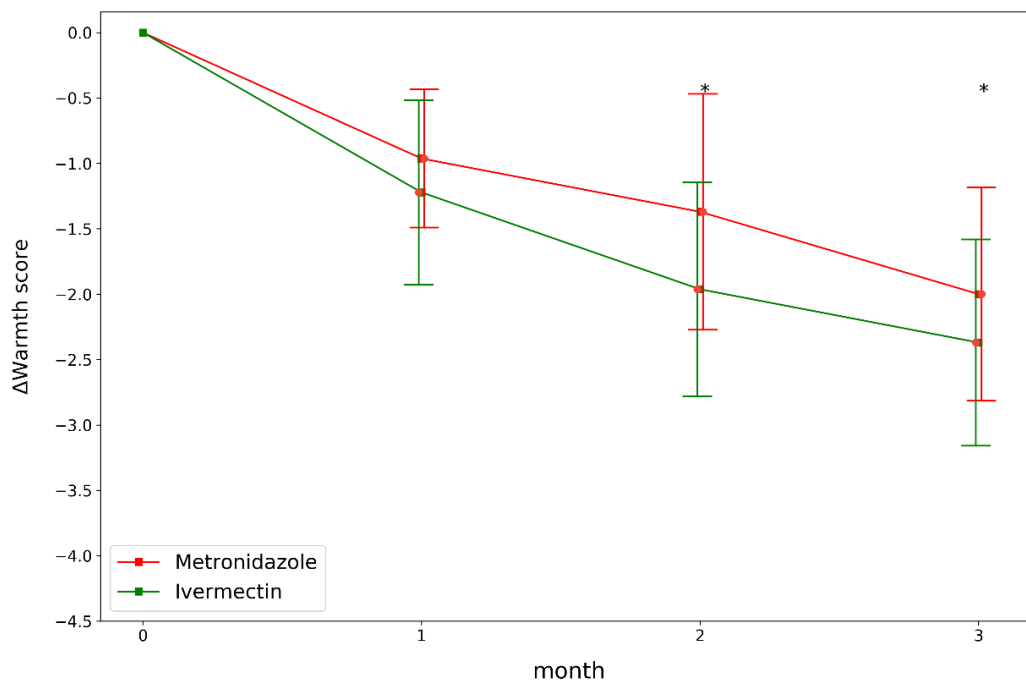


Fig. S4. Tingling score of metronidazole and ivermectin

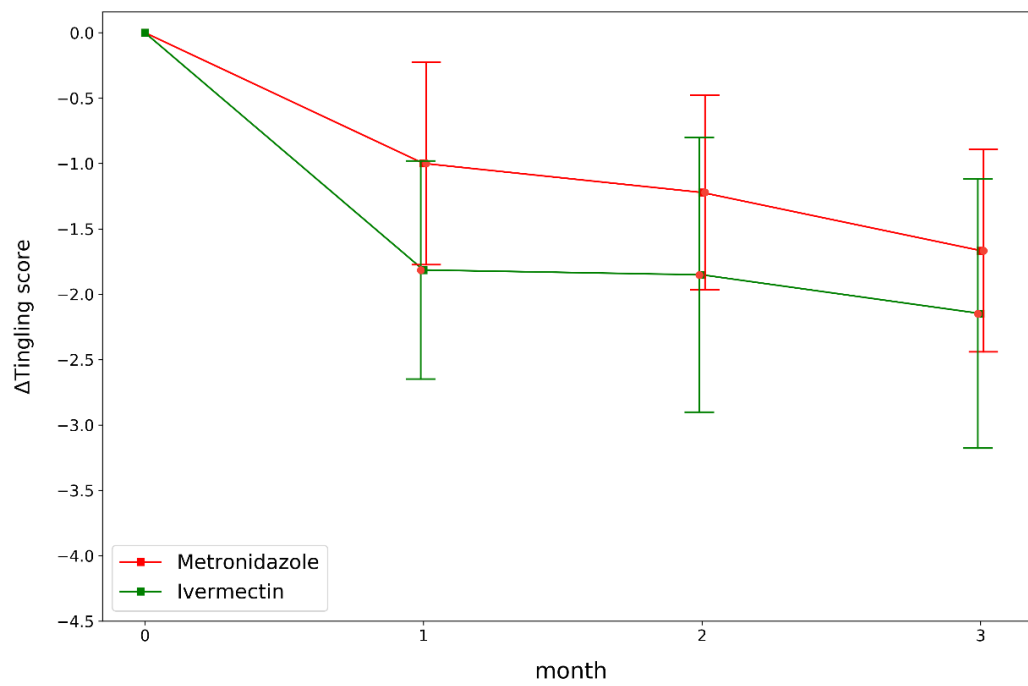


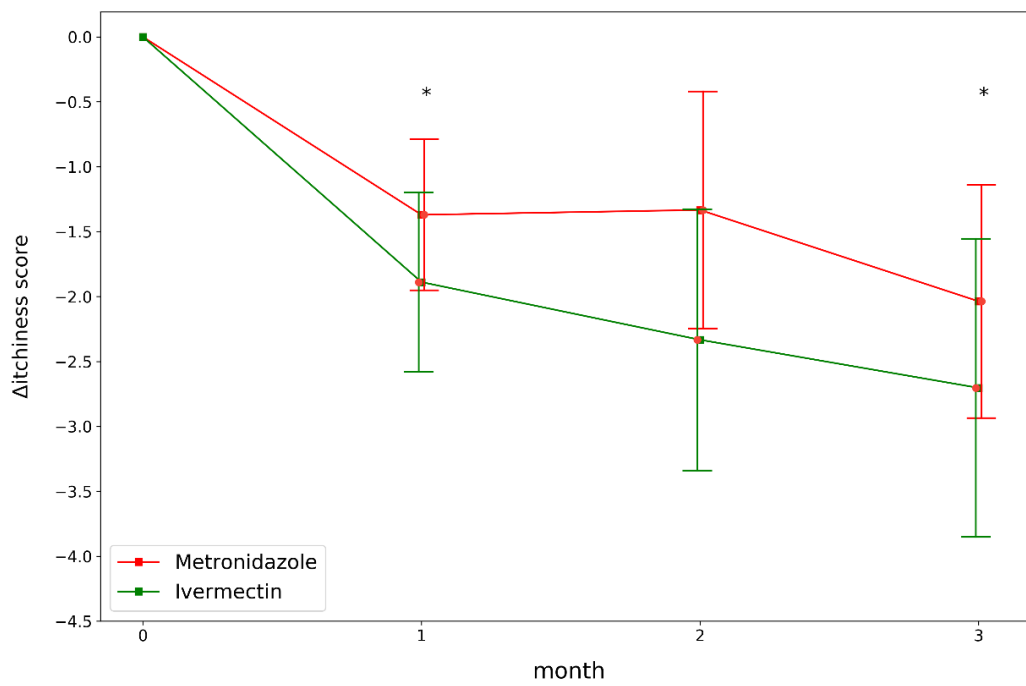
Fig. S5. Itchiness score of metronidazole and ivermectin (*: $p < 0.05$)

Fig. S6. Skin texture score of metronidazole and ivermectin

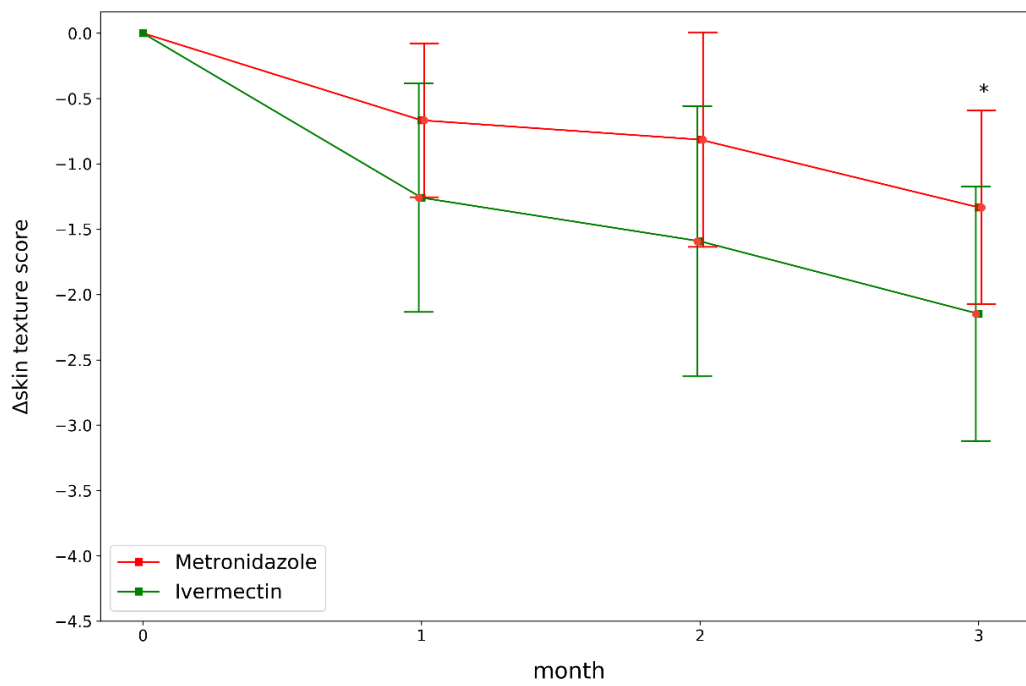
