

EDITORIAL

It is the pleasant duty of the Editor of ACTA ODONTOLOGICA SCANDINAVICA to place on record a recent development of great importance to the future of the journal :—

Following an invitation by the founder members, i.e. the National Dental Associations of Denmark, Finland, Norway, and Sweden, four of the Dental Schools in Scandinavia have accepted membership of the ACTA ODONTOLOGICA SCANDINAVICA FOUNDATION and have elected representatives to serve on the Editorial Board of the journal.

Largely due to the foresight and abiding support of the professions in the four Scandinavian countries during the past decade ACTA ODONTOLOGICA SCANDINAVICA has developed into a recognized scientific journal of world-wide circulation. Under the new scheme of management active support and leadership by the professional organisations will be of no less importance. However, since the majority of articles are written by academic authors the professional organisations have deemed it appropriate to share the responsibility of forming the policy of the journal with the teaching and research institutions.

The agreement now voluntarily reached between the professions and the schools speaks highly of the spirit of co-operation prevailing in both quarters and there is every reason to believe that the actual co-operation will be most happy and profitable.
